KENNEL CLUB BREEDERS COMPETITION 2009

The following Award is offered: **BEST BREEDER IN BREED**

To recognise and support the commitment and talent shown by UK breeders, the Kennel Club has created a new competition – **The Kennel Club Breeders' Competition**. The competition creates a new arena where breeders can demonstrate their breeding skills and take pride in showing off their stock.

Manchester Dog Show Society played host at its Championship Show in 2009 to the official launch of the Kennel Club Breeders' Competition, with a Crufts Final in 2010 and the main features are:

- Competition schedules at all Championship shows for every breed, with or without CCs (Breed Club, Sub Group, Group and General Championship Shows included).
- Entries can be made on the day of competition.
- Breeders become eligible to enter by having bred four dogs being present and exhibited at that show in the breed.
- Competition judged by the breed judge immediately after awarding Best of Breed and Best Puppy in Breed.
- **There is no entry fee payable.**

The following requirements apply to entry for these awards:

- 1 Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from The Kennel Club.
- 2 The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group or team.
- 3 The Breeder must complete the record book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
- 4 The Breeder is responsible for obtaining the necessary authority to compete from the show Secretary to compete for the award.
- 5 The Breeder's team must comprise of four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
- 6 A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
- 7 All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
- 8 The 'beaten dog' rule will NOT apply.
- 9 Twenty points are required to qualify for the Finals at Crufts in the following year. Points are cumulative over a calendar year and are gained as follows:

Breed Win	1 point
Fourth in Group	1 point
Third in Group	2 points
Second in Group	3 points
First in Group	4 points

Breeders gaining 20 points should apply to the Canine Activities Department at The Kennel Club to apply for the Crufts Final. After amassing 20 points a breeder cannot enter any further Best Breeder Competition for that calendar year.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word 'Dog' includes both sexes)

Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.

In the following Definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. **19TH October, 2009**.

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9 (j) and 20.

(2) Transfer: (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of their being no equivalent, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or Junior class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or in the event of their being no Puppy or Junior class respectively to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibitor arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered the dog may NOT be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not won a three Challenge Certificate under three different judges or seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN: For dogs of not less than six years of age on the day of the Show.

SPECIAL POST GRADUATE: As for Post Graduate but restricted by coat.

SPECIAL OPEN: As for Open but restricted by coat.

BRACE: For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in another class other than Brace or Team.

KENNEL CLUB BREEDERS COMPETITION: For dogs bred by Exhibitor

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 10.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.30 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **Entry Fees:** Members First Entry @ £15.00 per Dog; subsequent Classes @ £2.  
Non-Members First Entry @ £17.00 per Dog; subsequent Classes @ £2. Catalogues £2.00 with entries; £2.50 on the day. Advertisements in the Catalogue £5.00 for Full Page.  
NO entries will be accepted unless accompanied with the appropriate entry fees, including Membership dues. No acknowledgement will be sent unless a stamped addresses postcard with 'RECEIPT' written on the reverse side is enclosed for the Secretary's signature. Passes will NOT be sent. A £10.00 fee will be charged on any cheques which have to be represented.
7. There will be no Prize money paid at this show.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show** - Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.  
**Withdrawal from Competition:** Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than breed classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from any variety classes when judged before breed classes.  
**Proviso** - For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
12. **Best in Show** - The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs.

Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

**Withdrawal from Other Competition** - Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from any variety classes when judged before breed classes.

**Proviso** - For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F. (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. All dogs resident outside the U.K. must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor / competitor.
17. DOG FOULING: Any owner / handler / exhibitor or other person in charge of dog(s) is required to remove as soon as possible, any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and their approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
18. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of the dogs sent for exhibition and for any other property entrusted to them but it must be distinctly understood by exhibitors and purchasers of dogs, and all other persons, that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of or damage to a dog or dogs or any other property, whether arising from accident or any other cause whatever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants or others, and it is on this understanding that entries are received.
19. Should any Judge be prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another Judge or Judges in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition, but no entry fees can be returned. (Vide Kennel Club Show Regulations).
20. An announcement prior to the closing date of entries in 'Our Dogs' or 'Dog World' of any alteration or additions made in the Schedule or in these Regulations, shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.
21. In case of emergency, as to which the Committee shall be the sole judge, the Committee may, at their discretion, alter the date and place of holding the Show, either before or after entries are received. In case of such alteration, no exhibitor shall be entitled to the return of entry money which may have been paid before receiving notice of the same.

### **EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE**

## **REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)**

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.
  - (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the Show and from any award gained therein.
  - (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2.
  - (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
  - (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
  - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
  - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed
  - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
